***Q. I am an Active Member of the SAVT and I am not working in the field. May I drop my membership to Associate?**

A. The SAVT Bylaws do not support Associate Memberships for those who qualify for an Active membership in our Province. If you live in Saskatchewan, have graduated from an accredited school and have written the national exam, you DO qualify for Active membership and are not eligible for Associate membership.

Even if you no longer work in the field at this time (raising a family, moved, etc), there is always the chance that you may return to work as a veterinary technologist. Letting your membership lapse means you have not maintained your continuing education credits which are very important to keep updated on the industry as it is ever changing. If you let your membership lapse over three years you must rewrite the Veterinary Technician National Registration Exam (VTNE) administered by the AASVB. If you are not an active member, you are no longer eligible to transfer to another province to work.
