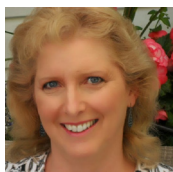

This presentation will have an overview of some of the diseases we've seen in the last few years across the prairies in beef cow herds. From tuberculosis to Johnes we will explore some of the factors that cause these outbreaks to occur.

Dr. John Campbell graduated from the Ontario Veterinary College in 1985. After several years of rural veterinary practice, he returned to Guelph to complete a Doctor of Veterinary Science degree in Ruminant Health Management. He has worked as a faculty member on the Ruminant Field Service Practice at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Saskatchewan since 1991. He is currently department head of the Department of Large Animal Clinical Sciences and his main research interests are infectious diseases and disease surveillance in beef cattle. He also acts as the director for the college's Disease Investigation Unit which is funded by Saskatchewan Agriculture. Dr. Campbell has over 70 scientific publications in scientific journals along with numerous conference proceedings. He has been the recipient of five teaching awards at WCVM and is the past recipient of the Western Canadian Association of Bovine Practitioners Veterinarian of the Year Award and the Carl Block Award for contributions to Canada's animal health programs.

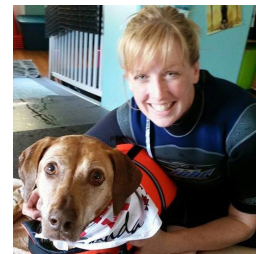
This talk will cover common zoonotic diseases in zoological companion animals. Additionally, there are a few diseases that are carried by humans and can be transmitted to ZCA species that will be covered, as well as diseases that may be transmitted between ZCA species.

Dr. Sadar is a 2009 graduate of the Colorado State University's College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences. She completed a one-year

clinical internship in zoological, exotics, and wildlife (ZEW) medicine at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in 2010. After finishing a two-year fellowship at the Wildlife Center of Virginia, she completed a zoological companion animal residency at the University of California, Davis. Dr. Sadar was an assistant professor in the ZEW service at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine prior to moving back to Colorado State University as an assistant professor in the Avian, Exotics, and Zoological Medicine Service. In 2016, Dr. Sadar became a Diplomate of the American College of Zoological Medicine (ACZM), with a focus on zoological companion animals.

Dr. Sadar's research interests focus around minimally invasive modalities to decrease stress, both situational and painful stress, in ZEW species.

Mobility Matters: The Veterinary Technician's Role in Physical Rehabilitation

This lecture will provide an overview of how technicians can take the lead on pet mobility in their practices, maximize mobility safely, and improve patient care.



Jenn Panko owns and manages The SPAW, a pet rehabilitation, sports medicine, and fitness centre in Aldergrove, British Columbia in partnership with the Aldergrove Animal Hospital. She is a Registered Veterinary Technologist (Seneca College, Ontario, 2005) where she was the recipient of the Veterinary Technology Recognition and Appreciation Award for dedication to and excellence in animal care. She completed the University of Tennessee Certified Canine Rehabilitation Practitioner Program in 2006. In 2012 she completed the University of Tennessee Certified Osteoarthritis Case Management Program and was the recipient of the Ontario Association of Veterinary Technicians Award of Merit for enhancing the image of the veterinary technology profession and a long standing history of community service for her volunteer work teaching therapeutic horseback riding lessons to children and adults with diverse physical and intellectual abilities. In 2014 she completed the University of Tennessee Companion Animal Pain Management Certificate Program. In 2017 she obtained her Veterinary Technician Specialty (VTS) in Physical Rehabilitation. Her clinical experience includes a variety of work in private, referral, and academic companion animal practice, mobile, racetrack, and surgical equine practice, and wildlife rehabilitation. Jenn has a wide variety of experience in orthopedic, neurologic, weight loss, and conditioning rehabilitation. She developed her tool box of rehabilitation skills at the Mississauga-Oakville Veterinary Emergency Hospital and Referral Group, coordinating CARE, The Companion Animal Rehabilitation Experts, and Rehabilitation Service. She also managed the neurology and MRI service where she developed her technical and anaesthesia skills. Prior to her relocation to British Columbia she was part of the team at the Hill's Pet Nutrition Primary Healthcare Centre, as a Primary Healthcare Technician and Coordinator of the Fitness and Rehabilitation Service at the Ontario Veterinary College, University of Guelph.

She is pleased to be co-coordinator of the "S.W.I.M. Alpacas and llamas are not like other ruminants. Caring for them provides some unique challenges that should be considered. This presentation will aim to highlight some of these unique features, what they mean for the care (especially in a hospital setting) and will briefly talk about common presenting complaints

Dr. Uehlinger earned her degree in Veterinary Medicine from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Bern, Switzerland, in 2002. In 2008, she received her PhD from the University of Prince Edward Island, Atlantic Veterinary College. She is a 2011 Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine, Speciality: Large Animal Internal Medicine. She also attained National Board Certification with the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association in 2011. Dr. Uehlinger teaches in the areas of Large Animal Internal Medicine with a particular focus on food and production animals. She has a special interest in diseases of dairy calves and in small ruminant and camelid health. Her research interests are grounded in a desire to work collaboratively by combining her epidemiology skills, expertise in food animal medicine and her passion for animal health and human livelihoods, both in Canada and abroad. Her research background lies in veterinary epidemiology, specifically in zoonotic protozoa in livestock and her primary interests include health management of food and production animals from an epidemiologist's perspective. She currently focuses her research in Canada on calf health and production management.
